SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

"Any even-numbered section" of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at any Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.
(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

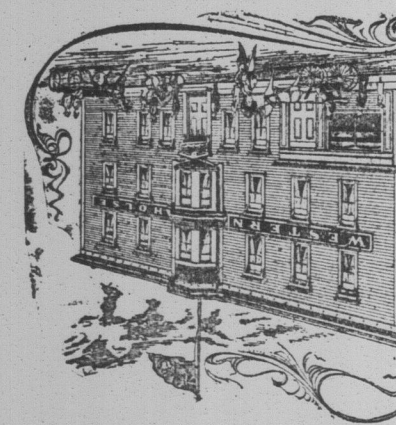

A Common Tie

In New Zealand a few days since and now in Australia, the Australasian subjects of King Edward are making much of the blood relationship, the kinsmanship, that unites America with these great members of the British Empire. Alfred Deskin, Prime Minister of the Australian Commonwealth, in his address of welcome yesterday said: I trust that President Roosevelt will be informed in the words of the famous American captain, Josiah Tatnall, that blood is, and always will be, thicker than water. In other words, there are influences that draw English speaking nations and peoples together when other nations, by reason of different race or language, sometimes repel one another. The Briton is jealous of his blood. In private he has sometimes sneered at the American who boasts British ancestry. Nor is there any reason why the Australian should not be a good Briton in his respect. For all the 3,774,882 inhabitants of the commonwealth in 1901 over 95 per cent. were of English, Scottish or Irish descent. We know that considerably less than a third of Americans come of our early nineteenth century stock. We know that our Anglo-Saxon strain, while a large one, is crossed deeply with many others. But we boast the blood allegiance that Australia boasts, language and common laws, history and institutions, and, above all, a common consensus of rights and wrongs, have kept us Anglo-Saxon to the core. And no matter what floods of immigration come to us, they all seek the same high level. The blood tie is more than a relationship. It is a civilization, and it is that which Australia celebrates this week.—New York Globe.

The Liberal Party Strong and United

Considering that the Liberal Government has been in power for twelve years, the situation has changed very slightly. The Liberal party is still strong and united, its opponent is still weak and divided. On the question of tariff the Opposition is completely at sea. Western Conservatives some time ago voted for reduction. To-day there is a sort of revival of high protectionist doctrine in the Conservative press. There is a gleam of hope in the protectionist victories in England, and a feeble effort to hitch the Conservative wagon in Canada to that disant star. It is argued that we ought to have in Canada a Government that will sympathize with the English movement for preferential trade. At the same time the high protectionist wing of the party is clamoring for the abolition of the British preference in woolsens. When the All-Red route was under discussion in Ottawa, Mr. Foster began by claiming that the Conservatives were the real authors of the scheme, and ended by voting with the rest of his party against it. In person the party is worse off than when it suffered defeat in 1896. Mr. Borden has not the faculty of arousing enthusiasm, and Mr. Foster's enthusiasm is that of a wet blanket on a fire. The combination does not possess the confidence of the country. No man who uses his cold judgement will say that a better ministry than the present one, could be constructed out of material available in the Opposition.—Toronto Star.

She had been smothered to death by quick diphtheria. The girl had been pronounced dead."

Dr. Louis Syman, who arrived after life seemed extinct, quickly slit the child's windpipe with an ordinary pen-knife, the only instrument available and inserted a rubber tube, borrowed from a neighbor's fountain syringe. No blood at all flowed when the incision was made. "After an hour's work by the physician, who breathed into the tube and worked the chest, the child resumed breathing. At the same time, black blood, as thick as felt, flowed from the wound. It is said she will recover. "The case is pronounced as one of the most remarkable in the history of surgery."
