MARINE NOTES
OF THE WORLD

SIGHTED 35 ICEBERGS.

Schr Pretorian reports Aug. 15, lat 53 42 N, long 48 47 W, passed a large iceberg and several growlers; lat 53 04, lon 51 25, a large berg; lat 52 55, lon 51 34, another; lat 52 46, long 52 09, two large bergs; from lat 52 20, long 53 47 to Belle Isle, saw fifteen large bergs, and from Belle Isle to Cape Norman, twelve more; also 3 large bergs thence to Point Amour. Thirty-five bergs in all.

THE ALLAN LINE.

The Allan Line Corsican was reported 30 miles east of Belle Isle at 3 a. m. yesterday. She will arrive in Quebec on Thursday and in Montreal on Friday. The Allan liner Ionian was reported 160 miles west of Point Amour at 10 a. m. on Monday and will arrive in Havre on Wednesday.

THE BATTLE LINE.

The Battle Line steamer Tanagra, Captain Dalton, passed Copenhagen yesterday, bound from Ypsila for Cardiff.

ARRIVED AT ST. STEPHEN.

The British schooner Victoria arrived at St. Stephen on Sunday, with a cargo of molasses from Barbados, for W. C. Purves. The schooner made the trip in 17 days, having encountered calm weather and adverse winds. She will sail for her home port, Lunenburg, N. S., when her cargo is discharged. The schooner Pendleton Sisters has arrived from Philadelphia, with coal for the Maine Central.

WILL BE BURNED.

The old United States ship Santee, a relic of the early American navy and later a prison ship and a training ship for the Naval Academy at Annapolis, has just been towed to Boston, and will be burned in a few days for her metal.

DANGERS TO NAVIGATION.

Star Coya (Br.) reports Aug. 20, lat 28 58 N, lon 68 47 W, passed a red bell buoy adrift.

Star Eikon reports Aug. 24, lat 24 40 N, lon 83 36 W, passed a large piece of wreckage at 7:25 p. m., apparently a ship's side, 70 to 80 feet long. The derelict sighted on Pollock Rip Shoal Aug. 17 proves to be the British schooner Parana, which sank on the shoal Aug. 10. The wreck has been towed into Vineyard Haven.

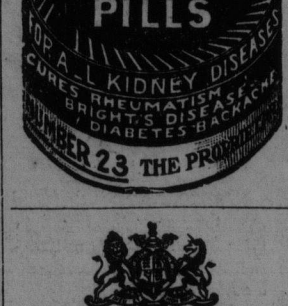
