Association Hall.

The building, which was erected in 1886, and furnished by the Ladies' Auxiliary, is open every day, except Sunday, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Its privileges are open to all students. The Reading Room is well supplied with newspapers, periodicals and magazines. The parlor is very comfortably furnished, and members will always find at their disposal a piano, an organ, college song books, and games.

Library.

The Library of the Association is composed chiefly of works on missions. Books will be let out on application to the General Secretary or any member of the Rooms' Committee, and should be returned at the end of two weeks.

Boarding Houses.

At the office of the Association students will find a complete list of rooms and boarding houses, which have been inspected personally by the members of our Fall Campaign Committee. During the first week of October members of this Committee will be in attendance, and will give all possible assistance to new students.
