BOLDUC, JOSEPH. (*Beauce.*)

Is a notary, and largely engaged in agricultural pursuits. S. of the late Captain Augustin Bolduc, who was one of the earliest settlers in the parish. B. on 22 June 1846. Ed. in Ste. Marie. M., at St. Francois de la Beauce, 12 Oct. 1873; M. A. G. Mathier, dau. of Jean Mathier, Esq. Is Mayor of the parish in which he resides, and Warden of the County; also a Director of the County Agricultural Association. Was elected, June 1876, a mem. of Prov. Board of Notaries for Prov. of Quebec. First returned to Parliament on 18 Oct. 1876. Re-elected at last g.e. In politics "National."—*St. Victor de Tring, Co. Beauce, P.Q.*

BORDEN, FREDERICK WILLIAM, B.A., M.D. (*Kings, N.S.*)

S. of the late Dr. Jonathan Borden, who practised his profession in Kings, his native county, for thirty years. B. in Cornwallis, Kings, N.S., 14 May 1847. Ed. at King's College, Windsor, in Arts, where he took degree of B.A., 1866; and at Harvard Medical School, Boston, in Medicine, where he took degree of M.D., 1868. M., 1 Oct. 1873, Julia M., dau. of John H. Clarke, Esq., of Canning. (she died) First returned to Parl. for present seat, at g.e. 1874; re-elected at last g.e. A Reformer.—*Canning, N.S.*

BOULTBEE, ALFRED. (*East York.*)

Called to the Bar, U.C., Trinity Term, 1855. Practised law in Newmarket for nearly twenty-five years, and, since then, in Toronto. Took a very active part in politics and local affairs for many years. Was a Reformer, and supported the Hon. Robert Baldwin, but was much dissatisfied with the treatment of that statesman by the Grits, and gradually drew away from the party—with many other leading Reformers. Started the *North York Sentinel*, which he edited during its existence. Was Reeve of Newmarket for many years continuously. Organized the New-
