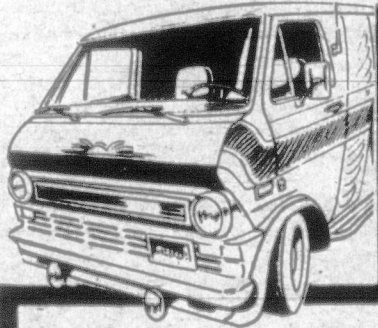

North Bay Trappers, enjoying power plays for much of the first period, built up a 4-1 lead and went on to defeat Dixie Beehives 7-3 in Provincial Junior A action Thursday night.

The loss was the Beehives second in a row and third in the last four games, dropping their record to 16-13-1. Beehives have a six-point edge on sixth-place Richmond Hill Rams.

With the win, North Bay moved into a tie with Guelph Platers for first place.

Beehives took 67 minutes in penalties to North Bay's 34 minutes. In less than two periods, Beehive winger Chris Costello was handed five minor penalties, a major and a misconduct. He left the game with a hand cut

that required 10 stitches.

Bob O'Brien brought trouble upon himself by getting two consecutive slashing penalties early in the first period. After an incident, the referee handed him a misconduct, a major misconduct and two automatic minors, leaving the Beehives short-handed.

Costello found time to score one of the three Dixie goals between stunts in the penalty box. Russ Foster and Mark Duck scored the other Beehive goals. Randy Dupre picked up two assists.

Costello, O'Brien and Randy Cunneyworth scored in the 6-3 loss to Richmond Hill.

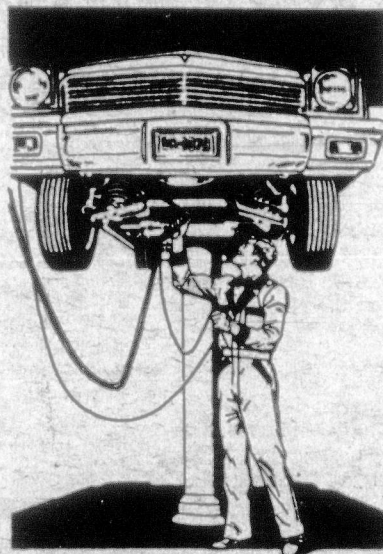
Beehives played Aurora last night (after press time) and take on Guelph Holody Platers New Year's Day at Dixie Arena. Game time is 8 p.m.
