Camp Borden	18-8-44		The famous Mart Kenny band put on a show in the Station Theatre from 1930 to 2100 hours which was very much enjoyed by the station personnel.	✓
	19-8-44		A bush fire was reported to have started at 1330 hours today at the bombing range. At 1615 hours it was reported from Edenvale that the Edenvale crew were fighting a grass fire in their own area. Volunteers and fire-fighters were mustered for the bush fire.  Night flying washed out at 0100 hours. Night flying time 48:40 hours. 0800 hours ceiling and visibility unlimited. Flying washed in at 0800 hours. Washed out at 1700 hours. Flying time 318:05 hours. Night flying washed out.  Edenvale: Flying washed in at 0800 hours. Washed out at 1700 hours. Flying time 89:50 hours.  At 1430 hours fire-fighters and 16 volunteer cadets went to the bombing range to pick up equipment lost the previous night and put out a few smouldering stumps. On arriving they found fire starting up anew and remained there until 1945 hours. They were relieved at 2000 hours by fire-fighters and volunteers for the night.  The Annual Track and Field champions for No. 1 Training Command witnessed No. 1 S.F.T.S. place fifth totalling 8 points.	✓
	20-8-44		At 1715 hours Harvard 11B FE763 groundlooped and aircraft nosed over on its back. The pilot, F/O L.S. Hammond (J15539), pupil, was uninjured. He claims the left brake seized. This resulted in an "A" category crash.  Sunday. No flying.  At 0700 and 0900 hours the R.C. Church Service was held in the Airmen's Lounge. Holy Communion was celebrated in the chapel in the lounge at 0800 hours. The Voluntary Church Service was held in the theatre at 0900 hours.	✓
