

and by the Auditor General's office,
and the supposition of the Indians
in this respect is unfounded;
but there will be no objection to
instructing the Indian Agent at
Haintowaming to render to each
Head Chief a list showing the
amount payable to his Band
at each distribution.

As regards this request
that a fair increase be made
annually to their annuity as
promised, I have already said
that as soon as the debt in
connection with the survey
has been wiped out, the annuity
will increase; but until that
is done, no further increase
than what the sales of the
lands
