811,-Referring to previous correspondence regarding the transfer of Robert Cate to the Crowstand Boarding School from the Brandon Industrial School, which was authorized by the Department on the strength of your recommendation. I beg to may that the principals of both these schools have written the Department objecting to this transfer. The principal of the Crowstand school eave that it would be useless to expect the boy to conduct himself properly unless Chief Cote and some of his friends adopt a more just and reasonable attitude towords his school and claims that the attitude of the Chief and his followers has been the cause of all the tranney he has hed at the school for the past year. The Department is forsed to the conclusion that there is a good deal of truth in the principal's statement, and it wishes you to inform Chief Cote that the Department's action in allowing this boy to rementer the Growstand Boarding school is on the distinct understanding that from henceforth he will raise no further opposition to the school.
