



Ottawa, 3rd August 1916.

Sir,-

In reply to your letter of the 14th ultimo I beg to inform you that the Whitefish Indian Reserve referred to is owned by the Indians in common. It has also never been sub-divided into lots. There are no side fences to be erected except perhaps in isolated cases where an Indian has made some effort to cultivate a small piece of land. Fencing of the railway becomes necessary in order to prevent the Indian stock from straying on to the track.
