

SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE

in the case of

E. 4630 Private Roger LAROSE, Royal 22e Regiment, a soldier of the Canadian Army, Overseas.

By direction of the Commanding Officer the Summary of Evidence is taken on oath.

FIRST WITNESS Lieutenant Come Simard, Royal 22e Regiment, having
FOR PROSECUTION been duly sworn states:

On the 9th of June 1943, at about 1800hrs, as I was parading Private Larose to the Commanding Officer's office, I told Private Larose to look in front of him, as he was standing to attention. For a short while he looked in front of him. But after a few minutes, he again looked at me. The Commanding Officer told him to look straight in front of him and at that moment, he jumped and struck me at the throat. The R. S.M. tried to stop him but he struck the R. S. M. on the ear. He was immediately carried out of the office.

SECOND WITNESS R. S. M. J. M. Tremblay, Royal 22e Regiment, having
FOR PROSECUTION been duly sworn states:

On the 9th of June 1943, as I was on duty in the Commanding Officer's office, I saw that Private LAROSE, was looking at Lieut. C. Simard. Lieut. Simard told him to look in front of him. He did for a short while, but again looked at lieut. Simard. At that moment, he jumped and struck lieut. Simard on the throat. He said "You told me dam Christ that you would put me in trouble."
