- Q. You say the civilian police came up followed by Military police and the Court has heard evidence that a crowd had gathered.
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. How many people?
- A. 25 or 30
- Q. Have you gone over this road a number of time returning to your billets, previous to or subsequently, to the accident?
- A. I have not previously been over the road.
- Q. What would you say about the number of people walking along this road?
- A. Early in the evening there were few people. At that time there
