The following examples are given to illustrate still more clearly the proper method of consulting the Tables:

Suppose you want to know what 33 bushels of corn, or a like number of any thing, would come to, at 67 cents per bushel:—by referring to page 92 (marked at the bottom thereof), and passing your eye over the numbers in the left-hand column until you come to 33, you will find opposite, and immediately in connection, \$22.11, the sum required.

Again: What would 27 yards cost, at three five-penny bits (or three sixteenths of a dollar)? By looking at the left-hand column, and the top, for the proper numbers, I find the answer to be 5 dollars, 6‡ cents.
