The Clerk informed the Members that, since the last Meeting of the House in General Assembly, Simon B. Robie, Esq. His Majesty's Solicitor-General, the Speaker of the House, has been appointed a Member of His Majesty's Council, and taken his Seat at that Board; and thereupon,

The said Members came to a Resolution as follows:—

Resolved, That the Seat of the said Simon B. Robie, Esq. Representative for the County of Halifax, and the Speaker of the House, be vacant by his appointment to a Seat in His Majesty's Council; and that the Clerk do inform His Honor the President, that, in consequence, the House are at present without a Speaker.

A Message was delivered from His Honor the President, by Mr. Deputy-Secretary Hill, commanding the attendance of the Members in the Council Chamber.

Accordingly the Members, with the Clerk, went up to attend His Honor in the Council Chamber; when the President of His Majesty's Council, by His Honor's command, said,

GENTLEMEN,

IT is His Honor the President's pleasure, that you, Gentlemen of the House of Assembly, repair to the place where you are to sit, and there proceed to the choice of some proper Person as your Speaker; and that you present such Person, whom you shall so choose, immediately for His Honor's approbation.
