DIFFICULT TO ENFORCE

"A law of this kind is difficult to enforce under any circumstances. Without the co-operation of the substantial portion of the people of the province it would be impossible to enforce, so we say to you, if this law is proposed, we must first see that almost certain in any case to be the death of much of the red tape that has entangled, and more or less, strangled, cupid.

"On that point I will relieve you any anxiety you may have," he said, "I have this to say: that any vote that may be required by this Government will be taken up by the members of the Legislature to the position we now occupy, and that will be the result of the vote."

BERLIN CASUALTY LIST

Only 202 Brandenburgers Put Out, According to It.

By Special Wire to the Courier. Berlin, March 8, via London, March 9.—Previous statements that German losses in the battle of Verdun are relatively light, seem to find corroboration in an official list of the casualties of the Twenty-fourth Regiment of Brandenburgers, who were in the thick of the fighting from the beginning and who stormed Fort Douaumont. The total casualties in the list are 202, whereof 90 are dead. Reports circulated in the town of Neuippin, the home garrison of the regiment, are to the effect that the total losses in the actual storming of the fort were only 18 killed and wounded.
