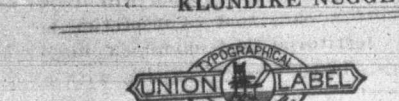

Of Awful Tragedy at Everett, Wash.

Mrs. Bucy Who Killed Husband, Child and Herself Was Undoubtedly Insane.

Everett, April 9.—The most shocking tragedy in the history of Everett occurred shortly after 7 o'clock this evening, when Mrs. Shepard R. Bucy killed her husband, who was assistant cashier of the American National Bank, their 4-year-old son, and herself, while in a fit of insanity.

From his position, by the side of a buffet, he must have struck it as he fell, for a large pool of blood was at its base. The clenched hand of Mrs. Bucy still retained the smoking revolver when assistance arrived at the house.
