KENTVILLE BOY WINS DISTINGUISHED CONDUCT MEDAL.

We are informed that Lee Harvey of Kentville now "somewhere in France," has been recommended for the distinguished conduct medal. This information comes to us through a letter from Ralph Corey to his father Capt. Corey, Ralph is on the same machine gun with Harvey," and writes this of his comrade. He sure deserves it. He took a stretcher out in broad day light with 8 men and old Fritz trying to get them all the way, with two four inch batteries. They had to lay the fellow down once and get into a shell hole. The fellow died after some days. A young Bishop from Nova Scotia." We the more gladly record this since the heroic spirit of

the young warrior has not permitted him to give any publicity of the matter. He mentions in his letter to his family that he rescued a wounded man, but his comment on the deed is that he regrets the man died a few days after.

SOME COLD.

Mr. Frank Andrews of the D. A. R., reports that on coming through Kennetcook on the Midland Ry. on Monday morning early the thermometer registered there 38 degrees below zero. At Kentville and vicinity it was registered from 12 degrees below and lower the lowest we heard for this vicinity being 22 below. "What is so rare as a day in June."
