dero was a brother of the deposed president. Gusavo Modero, the man who met such a tragic fate & to-day, was generally regarded as a much more powerful man than the President himself. After Francisco Madero had quarreled with Dr. Vasquez Gomez, he and his brother Gustavo, forced Jose Pino Suarez to the front to take the position of vice-president, although he
