SEALED TENDERS will be received at this
Office until the 27th day of February next,
(1855,) from any person or persons willing to con-
tract with the Government for the trans-
portation of passengers and freight, between
Charlottetown and Pictou, twice in each week,
between Charlottetown and Bedeque, from the
opening to the closing of the navigation in each year,
and between Charlottetown and St. John's, during
the same period. The tenders must be submitted
to the Colonial Secretary, or his Agent, in writing,
and must be accompanied by a statement of the
terms and conditions on which the services
are to be rendered, and a copy of the
agreement to be entered into with the
Government.

Tenders will also be received to contract to run,
for one or three years, a good and sufficient Steam-
ship, of convenient power, to carry Her Majesty's
Mail, and to run twice weekly between Bedeque
and St. John's, during the like above named period
in each year, and on such days and hours as may be
appointed by the Government.

Each of these Steam Vessels must be fitted and
provided with a competent crew, and capable for
the conveyance of Passengers and Freight, when
board competent Engineers, and be sufficiently
manured, furnished, and equipped for the performance
of the service, and be subject to the approval of
Commissioners to be appointed by the Government.
