GENEVA, July 3.
The casualties in Macedonia have been much greater than the published figures would indicate. The Servian Red Cross Society has telegraphed the Swiss Red Cross for doctors and nurses, the message stating that 3,000 wounded had already en brought from the front.

President and Mrs. Wilson have announced the engagement of their second daughter, Jessie Woodrow Wilson, to Francis Bowes Sayre, of Lancaster, Pa. The wedding will take place the last week in November, at the White House. Sayre is at present an attorney in the office of District Attorney Whitman, of

CHICAGO, July 3. Twenty-eight additional deaths oc-Chicago's total for the last three days, 111. There were more than 5,000 prostrations, and of these vic-tims many may not survive. Eighty-five babies have died here in the last three days of heat; 76 deaths are reported from various points in central and west Illinois. In one spot near the Union Station, 20 horses fell exhausted to-day inside two hours. Seven of them were shot.

MONTREAL, July 3. Grave fears are entertained that the entire crew of the barque Glen-mark, from Norway, have lost their lives. The Glenmark, now a danger-ous floating hull, was boarded on June 27th by Capt. Griffiths, of the C.P.R. liner Montezeuma, which arrived here this morning. The wreck was sighted 540 miles west of the Fastnet Lighthouse. lat. 50.57 north, long. 23.11 west. She is directly in the track of ocean liners, on her beam ends, mastless and sparless.

LONDON, July 3.

News received at Saloniki of the fight at Cuevgheli and of the passage of the Bulgarian Army through villages of the neutral zone, contains horrible details of the treatment meted out both to Servian prisoners and to the population in these re-gions by the Bulgarians, who burn-ed villages, and massacred many men, women and children. The Greek Army at Saloniki fear daily attacks in flagrant violation of a sworn compact; whilst atrocities by

LONDON, July 3. The Duke of Connaught's decision to resume his duties as Governor General for another year, appears to have been taken rather suddenly, and is owing to the King's express desire that his uncle should act as chaperon to the Prince of Wales, when h visits the Dominion next year. Th physicians assured the Duke that he need have no fear that the health of the Duchess would in injured by her spending another year in Canada. She is now almost well, and has been taking drives daily in the West End.

King Constantine, of Greece, in a statement to the British public statement to the British public, states that in spite of the agreement the Bulgarians had neglected to evacuate most points which they had promised to abandon. He says that ever since the occupation by the Bulgarian Army of the territories of Thrace and Macedonia, where the Greeks are in the majority, the population has suffered the harshes reatment. The Bulgarian Army has espected neither the property, the onor, nor the lives of the Greek population. After the flight of 40,000 Mussulmans from Bulgarian horrors, the mass of them the Greek government was compelled to maintain for six months in Saloniki. It was now the turn of the Greek population to in flight safety from the inhuman man tyranhy of the Bulgarians.
