Whereas we have learned of the decease of our Brother, Josiah Squibb, killed in action, October 19th, at Suvla Bay, Gallipoli Peninsula;

Be it resolved,—That we place on record in our minutes our deep sorrow at the loss of our Brother; that we record the fact that he was the first in Carbonara to enlist in the 1st Newfoundland Regiment and the first in Carbonara to make the sacrifice of his life for his King and Country; that a letter of sympathy be forwarded his father and family; that these Resolutions be forwarded to the Press for publication.
