"The immediate occasion of the conflicts in Chicago and elsewhere is said to have been the influx of negro workmen, with their families, into several of the States of the Middle West in the course of the war. The depletion of the labour market in the North and West and the attraction of high wages have affected the blacks during the al-sence of so many thousands of Amcricans in Europe as the same causes affected the stream of Latin and Slav mmigration in the years preceding the var. But with these differences. The talians and the peasants of Slavdom who may settle permanently in the States are only a degree or two less assimilable than the British or Scandinavians, who may pass almost unremarked into the melting-pot of Am-

"With the blacks there can be no question of fusion. Nominally they are American citizens. But in spite of Constitutional amendments they are denied political rights. The Labour Unions will not admit them to memtership. The colour bar is immovably fixed between them and the social life of the white community. They may not break bread in public with man or woman whose skin is of a different hue from theirs, and miscegenation and its unhappy products are abhorred unto the third and

fourth generation. Two Americas.

"In effect there are two Americas There is the America which we know as the virile cousin of all the races

of Europe, alert, resourceful, generous, enthusiastic, brimful of political ous, enthusiastic, brimful of political ideals, eager in political experiment, more than half willing to believe that it is an elect people whose destiny it is, as befits the heir of all the ages, to excel the grandest achievements of the human family in art, literature, and science. And there is the America which is unknown, except as a dark background to the energies of a mighty nation, the America twenty millions strong or thereby of which we get humorous or pathetic glimpses in verse or story, but for the rest is a cipher or a problem, according as we choose to throw it an indifferent glance or pause for a moment to look at the impassive countenance of the poor drudge, the black Cinderella of the American household. Well, it is the problem and not the cipher that is going to count.

"We are not innuendoing fault in anything that White America has done or left undone in respect of its dark inheritance. Given the same conditions, who among us would concede equality at bed and board and all the rest of it to a race in but not of our history, tradition, and culture, whose characteristics, physical and moral, whatever functions they may be deswhatever functions they may be destined to fulfil in the long evolution of the human family, arouse a certain antipathy or quicken an active sense of race superiority?

"The very fact that the hostility is so fundamental, however, renders this colour problem desperate, if not in-

"America has other colour questions to face. The question of the Red Man is being solved by his own more or less rapid disappearance. With the case of the Chinese and Japanese the Americans may continue to deal as they have dealt in the past, though at the risk of perils which passes. But the negro is a domestic question that will not die a convenient death, like the Sioux and Pawnees, but will be augmented from year to year by the natural growth of a prolific race, by the increased measure in which blacks will enter to compete with whites, and by the persistence with which the hewers of wood and carriers of water will advocate their right to political equal-
