It is planned to make the floor of the bridge 200 feet above high tide, thus giving shipping ample space to pass underneath. The cost of the structure is estimated at \$20,000,000.

Thousands of persons commute daily from their homes in Oakland, Alameda and Berkeley to their work in San Francisco. These cities, clustered directly across the bay, two and a half miles in width along this shore line, represent a population approaching the half million mark. Thus the commuters tax the capacity of the nu-merous ferries and the plea for bridge and subway has been general. The Golden Gate bridge would not be of direct benefit to these people; the site is several miles distant and not easily accessible.
