The Knatsu Cure

BLOWS THAT REVIVE BRAINS.

There would probably be consternaon if an examination candidate, askd how he would proceed to restore the apparently drowned, should reply, "I should kick him in the small of the back." Yet that is the way they go about it now in Japan

There is a spot in the middle of the back which they tell you is a very sensitive nerve-centre; a sharp blow there will stimulate the brain into immediate action. Speaking anatomically, the spot must be described as the base of the eleventh cervical vettebra; for the layman it would be simpler to say the eleventh knob of the spine counting from the large knob that marks the base of the neck.

This trick is part of the Japanese system known as "kuatsu," or the restoration of life. Kuatsu was a natural and inevitable sequel to jiu-jitsu. Several of the tricky throws practised by Japanese wrestlers, if they are not fatal in their effects, are at least sufvital processes.

An actual kick in the small of the back is the last resort, however. The blow is usually struck with the secand knuckle of the second finger. The smaller the striking surface the greater the stimulation of the nerve-
