had no one to represent them. He approved of the adoption of the Provincial franchise.

Mr. Cameron (Huron) congratulated the Minister of Justice on the approval accorded to the Bill from all sides of the House. He was, however, unfavourable to the abolition of the property qualification so long as property was the basis of the franchise. He did not approve the abolition of the public nominations, which he believed were useful in bringing the candidates face to face. Herecommended a morestringent supervision oi the voters' lists, and an amendment in the form of the oath. He was not enamoured of the ballot, but hoped it would correct some of the evils at present prevailing. He advocated compulsory voting.

Sir. John A. Macdonald, urged the retention of public nominations. Once abolish them, and no election would be uncontested. In the case of Ministers it was very important they should not be needlessly be opposed on going for reelection. He showed that in this particular the English precedent did not apply, owing to the very different state of things existing in the mother country. He preferred a uniform franchise, based on property. If the Provincial franchise were adopted it should be the one in force at a definite time, in order that the electoral vote for the Dominion should not be subject to local changes. The ballot had gone beyond discussion. He thought, however, that means should be provided for conducting a serutiny in case of an election being contested. With respect to the clauses for preventing corrupt practices, he feared they erred on the side of too great stringency.

Pere Richot has put in an affidavit before the Northwest Committee contradicting the statements made in Lord Lisgar's letter concerning the annesty to Riel.

The Dawson Road matter came up in the Public Accounts Committee this morning, and the Chairman asked Cunningham what grounds he had for the statement made by him concerning alleged frauds in its management. Cunningham replied that he believed he could prove fraud had been committed by accounts being post-dated two years, and certified to by parties who were not employed till long after date of such charges. A sub-Committee was appointed to investigate the whole matter, with power to send for persons and papers.

By a return asked for by Mr. Young, we learn that articles paying duty imported to Canada from the United States during the quarters ending the 31st of December in the years 1871, 1872 and 1873, were valued at \$2,345,036 in 1871, \$3,069,518 in 1872, and at \$3,786,572 in 1873, making a total increase on 125 articles of \$717,094. This increase is not on all articles, as a decided falling off appears in some things. Does this prove that Canada has not been the slaughter-house for American manufacturers that it has been represented to be?

Bishop Tache produced to-day, before the Northwest Committee, an original letter, written by Sir John Maedonald to him (Tache), in which was enclosed \$1,000, to be given to Riel as an inducement to leave for the United States. The letter has been placed on the fyle.


