Albertan's disclosure of conditions was to cause physicians to begin reporting the cases. A remarkable fact in this connection is that some of the physicians did not know until they read the article in The Morning Albertan that they are required, by the Dominion law, to report typhoid cases under penalty of \$50 fine. Dr. Estey, himself, is authority for that statement. The medical officer called attention to the fact that the law requiring reporting of cases had been in effect only about a year. He said that most of the physicians knew that theye were required to re-

port the cases but some of them, the younger ones, did not. Dr. Estey claimed, however, that he had had notices posted at the hospitals that doctors were required to report typhoid cases and had called it to their attention

whereever possible. BOARD OF HEALTH WILL ACT The Board of Health mem-

bership includes Mayor J. W. Mitchell, City Engineer J. T. Child, W. H. Manarey, Alderman J. G. Hester, and Dr. Egbert. Alderman Hester communicated with the mayor and Dr. Egbert and both agreed that in view of the exposures, it would be best to call a meeting of the board at once and take steps to see that the health of the citizens of Calgary is safeguarded as zealously as the Canadian Pacific railway is guarding the

Calgary physicians are chary of giving causes for the spread of the typhoid germs, and the majority are not in-clined to blame the city water

supply. Well water, milk and open closets are most generally blamed and herein lies the particular responsibility of the civic authorities inasmuch as if the city water supply were to blame, it might be urged that the trouble is caused by lack of filtration facitlities. While the medical officer has neglected-to have a basteriological test of the water made since about the first of last June, pevious tests have never

indicated the presence of typhoid germs. Mayor Mitchell is indignant that so many physicians have failed to report typhoid cases to the health department and will demand a thorough probe into this feature of the trouble. (Continued on Page 8)
