The Toronto ball team has disbanded for the season, the accident to Bill Phyle weakening the team to such an extent that the exhibition games arranged in Cincinnati, Canton and Youngstown have been called off. Only eleven players were to have been taken along, neither Carrigan or Hurley being able, making the trip although Bert Blue, the Columbus catcher, had signified his willingness of working behind the bat.

Phyle will be laid up several weeks.

The attendance all through the series at Columbus was bad, averaging seven hundred and fifty. The first game on Sunday drew but a small attendance, as it was wet and raw all day, while Monday was not much better. Yesterday was bright and sunny,

but the result of the series was a foregone conclusion, and interest was sadly lacking. As a result the Toronto players' 60 per cent of the proceeds amounted to but a slim \$40 apiece for the entire series.

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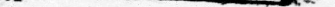
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
