A student when he gets in "a muss " should always be gentleman enough to give his name and address to the officers they do it in Berlin and Paris, and thu save a night spent in the lock-up, and i they are "sent for " next day they put i an appearance. An American writer, speak ing the other day of the London police. said. "We have come to regard every on of them as our friends." And that is the true conception that a policeman should form of his duties : he is the public friend of all but thieves and thugs. And the sooner any young man who is inclined to h noisy gets a similar idea in his head the better it will be for him.

THE GLOBE ON THE PARSON'S PETITION The Globe of Thursday has an editoric of remarkable ability and logical power of the proposed compulsory religious educa tion. It proves from statistics, in the first place, that under the existing school sys tem the hible is read daily in seven-eight; of the public schools of Ontario. AN ILLOGICAL POSITION.

The position taken by Father Stafford in reference to the public and separate schools. is as follows : First, the public schools are national, not Protestant. Second, the separate schools are purely Roman Catholic Arguing from that point, Father Staffore contends that the Roman Catholics should have exclusive control of their own schools, and at the same time dictate as to what text-books shall be used in the public chools. so nanifestly unfar and unjust. We id that if the R man Catholies are granted schools exclusively under their control, fair play demands that the jubic schools be in the broad sense Protestant. The logical conclusion of the position taken by Fa her Stafford would be the establishment of denominational schools for each pirticular sect. This would de-troy the public school system, and strike a deadly blow at the intellectual advancement of the 110 rince. By abolishing the seperate schole, and making the public schools non-dear mational, the plea put forward by Fa her Stafford, in reference to the text book question, would become valid. Then would the archbishop, or any other ecclesias ic be ustified in excluding any work, which reflected upon any creed. In the interests of liberal education and culture, we believe the change would be beneficial, but we entertain not the slightest idea that it would be consented to by the Roman Catholics. We have no desire to force any measure upon them, at the same time, we have no intention of quietly submitting to the scheme which gives exclusive control of one set of schools and at the ame time permits them to be censors of the public schools. To submit to such a plan, is to hand over to the Church of Rome the most powerful lever in the body politic-the education of the rising genera-
