From Typhoid—Only 14 From Diphtheria and Scarlet Fever.

The mortality returns for the past month show a decrease of 25 compared with those of the previous month. For the first time this year no death is attributed to typhoid fever, though there is an increase from 6 to 7 in the deaths from scarlet fever. Diphtheria is only credited with 7 deaths, the lowest figure touched this year. The deaths of children and of old people are considerably below the average.

At 8t. James' Cemetery, out of the 49 interments were 45 fewer than a year ago. Out of the 77 interments, 64 were those of children under 14. Only two of those buried were above, 70 years of age. There were nine deaths from convulsions, 5 from phthisis, 4 each from diarrhoea, cholera infantum diphtheria and drowning, 2 from scarlet fever, 1 each pneumonia, consumption, paralysis and accident.

At 8t. Michael's there were 52 interments.


