Convicted of Murder on Strength of an Alleged Vision.

Columbus, O., July 12.—The presentation of an application to the State Board of Pardons to-day on behalf of Jefferson Morehead, a life prisoner, brought to light the fact that the testimony of an alleged ghost was mainly instrumental in sending Morehead to prison. Nearly 17 years ago John H. Brock, a farmer living near Zanesville, was seen to go into a wood with dog and gun, presumably to bunt. He was never seen alive again. Two days later his body was found in the woods with a bullet hole in his head.

As he had often threatened to kill himself, it was supposed to be a case of suicide, and the coroner's jury so found. More than a year afterwards the mother of Brock had a vision in which she said her son appeared to her and, rising in his coffin, declared that he did not commit suicide, but was murdered by Jefferson Morehead. She instituted prosecution against Morehead with such persistence that, notwithstanding the lact that two grand juries and a maristrate's tracks.
