

### JUNIOR COLLEGE FOR COLLEGIATE

Would Be Tried Under Plan Proposed By Premier.  
NATURE OF EXPERIMENT  
University Course Would Be Shortened Accordingly.

Establishment of a junior college in the Central Collegiate is a possibility of the future, according to Chairman S. F. Lawason, of the Board of Education. The idea of junior university work in the secondary schools was placed before Premier Ferguson yesterday, with the strong recommendation of the Urban Trustees' Association and experiments will probably be conducted at one or more centers throughout the province.

The proposal has not been definitely worked out, but it would call for the teaching of university subjects in the upper school of the colleges, in order that higher education might be extended to all, regardless of means. Standing, of course, would be granted, which would reduce the college course considerably if the student decided to go ahead and obtain his B. A. degree. Principal E. A. Miller pointed out that there would probably be objections raised to the system, but that if an experiment was to be made the London Central Collegiate would be an ideal place to carry it out. The reason, he explained, was that the students outside of the first two years were divided according to subjects rather than years. Extra courses could be introduced for any pupils just the same as is done in the universities.

"One question which would have to be considered carefully first of all is how far the Government is willing to go in subsidizing the local Board of Education," stated Mr. Miller. "Liberal grants would be necessary and these are always problematical. A second question is whether the University of Western Ontario would approve of such a move. Unlike Toronto University, it has room to accommodate many more students and might resent the possible loss of students. At the same time, pupils can now obtain first year university standing by taking upper school work in the collegiate."

Chairman Lawason is in favor of having the proposed junior college discussed so that university training might be granted to the poor man's son as well as the rich man's.

### CLAIMS COURT HAS NO JURISDICTION

Unique Defense In Nonsupport Charge Fails.  
SCOTT HELD FOR SENTENCE  
Wife Lives Here; Husband In Michigan.

Men charged under the Deserted Wives Maintenance Act and under the criminal code, with failure to provide for their wives and children, must be tried by a court located in their place of domicile, according to a protest lodged by U. A. Buchner, counsel for Charles John Scott, accused of failure to support his wife and child, in city police court to-day. Mr. Buchner protested that the police court here had no jurisdiction in the present case, since Scott's domicile was not here and since his wife's domicile is his. The protest was made by the court stenographer at the request of counsel, but the hearing was proceeded with and the accused found guilty. Scott will be sentenced a week hence, Magistrate Graydon hinting at a year's imprisonment.

Scott, who is a resident of Battle Creek, Mich., and a railroad employee, was brought back to London two days ago from Sarnia by Detective Thomas Bolton. The couple were married in London in 1921 and took up their residence in Battle Creek two years ago. They returned to London on a visit to their parents, since which time, Mrs. Scott alleged, she had received no maintenance from her husband for herself or child of three years, and was not aware that her husband had divorced her.

Under Mr. Buchner's protest, husbands who desert their wives, would have to be tried by a court in their place of domicile instead of the place where the offense was committed, and it is the Deserted Wives Maintenance Act which, according to Mr. Judd, would be nullified.

The charges against Scott were one of failing to provide the necessities of life for his wife and child, dating on February 26, 1925, and six months prior thereto, but evidence regarding his alleged former failure was permitted to be introduced by the court.

Mrs. Scott, the wife of the accused, testified that the parents of both she and her husband reside in London and that they were married here in February 17, 1921. Two years ago next July the couple came to London on a visit, the wife staying for a short time with her husband at his relatives and later going to her own. Mrs. Scott claimed her husband returned to Michigan without telling her when he was going and that he left her penniless. The railroad pass on which they traveled was made out for two, and she declared he took it with him. She asserted she had received nothing from him since. The belongings of the couple in the room they occupied in Battle Creek had been shipped to London, she claimed.

SENT NO MONEY.

Mrs. May Scott, the mother of the accused, who resides at Highbury avenue and Trafalgar street, declared her daughter-in-law came to her a few days after coming to London on the visit two years ago and stated that she did not intend to go back and live with her husband. The witness admitted that she was more or less bitter against her son's wife and that she did not know of anything that caused the change of heart on the latter's part.

The prisoner admitted that he never sent his wife funds and claimed that he had received five answers to as many letters he had written to her asking her to come back. He obtained a divorce, he said, on July 1, 1924. He asserted that his wife never asked him for funds and that he had not married again.

Mr. Buchner, in summing up the evidence, claimed that a wife cannot establish a domicile separate from that of her husband and that the offense, if any, was therefore committed in the State of Michigan.

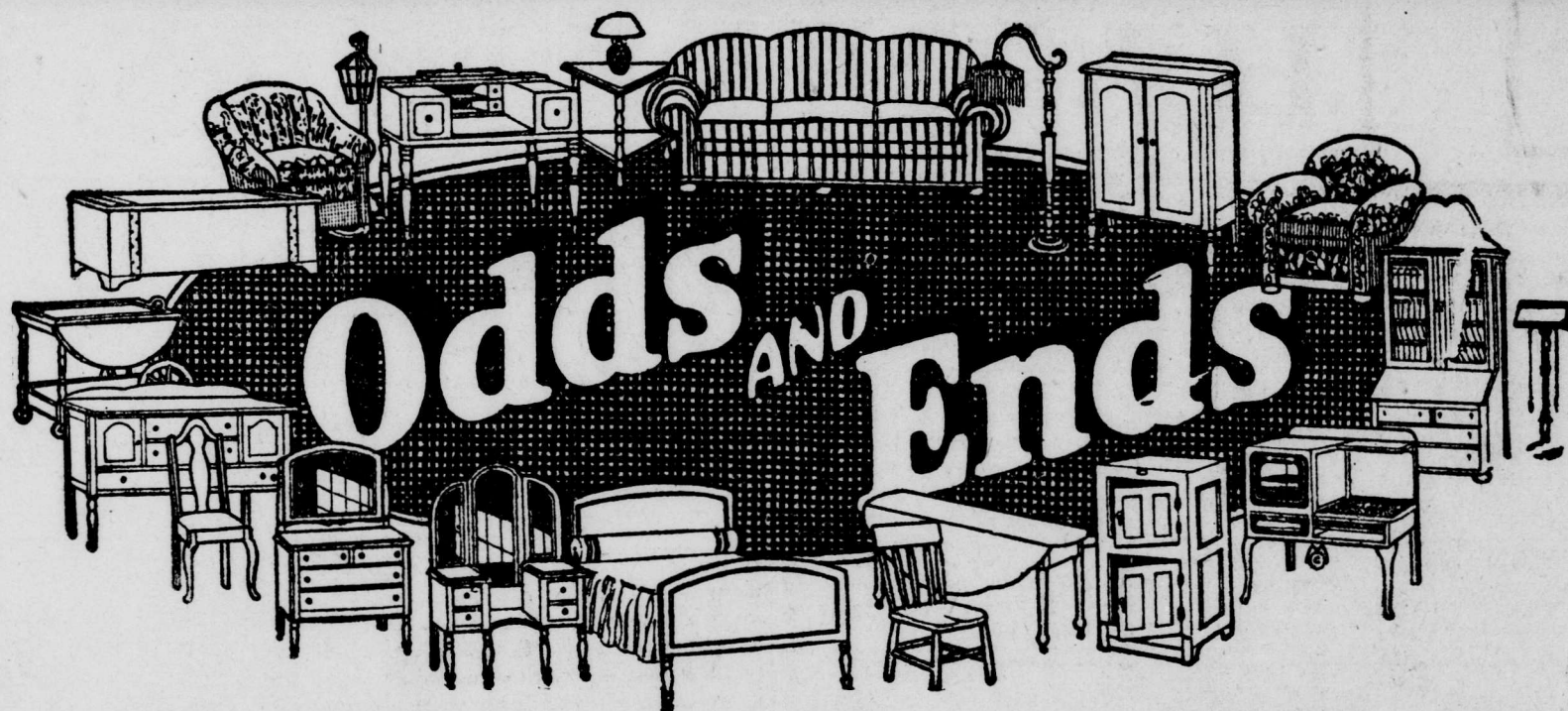
"I submit that there has been no desertion and that this court has no jurisdiction in this case," said Mr. Buchner.

"He is not charged with desertion, but failure to provide for his wife and child under the criminal code," returned the court.

"I submit that the prisoner's story should not be believed," said Crown Attorney Judd in his turn. "The whole deportment of the accused in the witness box shows his attitude."
