

still later it met in the vestry of the Baptist Church, and finally found lodging in a hall recently built by W. H. Longley. For many years a band of Hope called "Silver Spray" was conducted under the auspices of this division.

The advent of the Paradise Literary Society about the year 1892, diverted into a new channel much talent and energy that in former times had been tributary to the temperance stream, which had tended to make navigation thereon somewhat precarious. If these two now divergent streams could be reunited a craft might be kept afloat that in efficiency and usefulness would compare favorably even with good old Paradise Lodge.

The foregoing article was written several years ago, the occasion being of the celebration of the twentieth anniversary of the organization of the said literary society, when subjects indicative of various local activities were assigned to certain members to write up, that of temperance being given to the writer hereof. Since then Regina Division has become the dry water course of a has-been, and marks, apparently, the end of organized temperance effort in this place, while the literary society continues to flow serenely on.
