Just, in fact, as the offering of the Paschal Lamb was at the same time a Memorial of the Sacrifice offered on the occasion of the deliverance of Israel out of Egypt and was also itself a Sacrifice, pointing forward great Sacrifice of the Paschal Lamb on Cross, so the Holy Eucharist, sign the commanded elements of Bread while it is a Memorial, bringing before God the Sacrifice of the Cross, is also a re-presenting and pleading of that Holy Sacrifice, and is therefore the offering of a sacrifice in union with and in dependance upon the One Sacrifice of the Cross.

For the essential idea of a sacrifice is to make memorial before God, bring before God an appointed reminder.
