Dear Sir,

I have in my possession some old letters, a description of which may interest the readers of your paper. I wish also to get more information about them. One was sent from Prince Edward Island to Guysborough, on which are two post marks, Post Office, P. E. Island in large capital letters, in a circle with an outer and inner circular frame, leaving a blank centre, in which was placed the date, (26 Feb. 34) in ink with a pen. The other post mark is Halifax, N. S. (Mar 10 1834). At the right side the postage is marked thus :

The currency used then was £. s. d. so the postage on the letter was 1s. 5d. for a distance of about 100 miles. Why are the 11d and 2d added? Was the rate charged at different offices as the letter advanced to its destination? Another was mailed at Macan and had the following post marks, Cumberland N. S and Pictou N. S. It would appear from this that only post marks of the counties were used. The postage on this was 1s. 2d. marked, in the same as the other except different figures.
