The quantity of copper thus angually consumed is very heavy, India sheets being an important article of commerce.

Impervious Corks.

Corks may Le made impervious by soaking them (best quality) for several hours in a solution of one half ounce of glue or gelatine in a mixture of three-quarters of an ounce of glycerine and one pint of water, heated to about 50° Cent. Such prepared corks may be rendered nearly proof against acids and other chemicals if they are dipped, after thorough drying, for tea or fifeen minutes into a melted mixture of four parts of paraffin and one part of petrolatum.
