fifteen of these medals, either from the specimens themselves or good rubbings, and have only been able to distinguish two varieties.

- 13. Obv. GEORGIUS III DEI GRATIA. Youthful bust of George III to the right in armour. Seven rivets appear down the front of the armour. Rev. The royal arms on an oval shield, surrounded by the garter inscribed HONI. SOIT. QUI. MAL. Y. PENSE supporters, a lion to the left and a unicorn to the right; the paw of the lion touches the N in HONI. The quartering of the arms shows England and Scotland in the first, France in the second, Ireland in the third and Hanover in the fourth. Motto: DIEU.ET. MON. DROIT on a ribbon below: size 78 m.
- 14 Obv. As last, but eight rivets are shown on the front of the armour.
  - Rev. As last, but the lion's paw only reaches the I in HONI; size 77 m.
- 15 Obv. Similar to 13.
  - Rev. Similar to 13; size 59 m.

I have taken this description from Betts (1), as I have not had an opportunity of examining an example of this size, nor have I seen a rubbling.
