MacEACHEN, the Honourable ALLAN is Deputy Prime
Minister of Canada and Secretary of State for External
Affairs. He is the Member of Parliament for the Nova
Scotia riding of Cape Breton-Highlands-Canso and was
first elected to the House of Commons in 1953.
Mr. MacEachen has served as Minister of Labour,
Minister of National Health and Welfare, Government
House Leader, Minister of Manpower and Immigration,
President of the Privy Council and Minister of
Finance. A graduate of St. Francis Xavier University,
he received his M.A. from the University of Toronto and
did postgraduate studies in economics and industrial
relations at the University of Chicago and the
Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

MacGUIGAN, the Honourable MARK is Minister of Justice and Attorney-General for Canada and Member of Parliament for the Ontario riding of Windsor-Walkerville. He was first elected to the House of Commons in 1968 and was appointed Secretary of State for External Affairs in 1980. Prior to his election, Dr. MacGuigan was Dean of Law at the University of Windsor. A graduate of St. Dunstan's University in Charlottetown, he received his M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Toronto and his LL.M. from Columbia University.

MARCHAND, de MONTIGNY is Deputy Minister for Foreign Policy in the Department of External Affairs. He previously was Associate Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs, Deputy Secretary to the Cabinet (Operations) and Senior Assistant Deputy Minister (Policy) in the Department of Communications. A lawyer, Mr. Marchand is a graduate of the University of Montreal and received his M.S. in Communications from Boston University.

MASSE, MARCEL is Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs. He previously was President of the Canadian International Development Agency, Clerk of the Privy Council, Deputy Secretary to the Cabinet for Federal-Provincial Relations and President of the Council of Ministers of the Government of New Brunswick. A graduate of the University of Montreal, he received his LL.L from McGill, his B.Phil from Oxford and diplomas in External Relations, German, Italian and Economics from the Ecole des hautes études in Montreal.
