

**TREATY BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA AND THE
GOVERNMENT OF FINLAND CONCERNING EXTRADITION**

Canada and Finland,

DESIRING to regulate by mutual agreement their relations in the field of extradition and for this purpose to conclude a new Extradition Treaty,

HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE 1

1. Each Contracting Party agrees to extradite to the other Contracting Party, subject to the provisions of this treaty, any person found within its territory who is charged by a competent authority of the other Contracting Party with, or who has been convicted by such an authority of, an offence mentioned in Article 2 of this treaty committed within the jurisdiction of the Contracting Party requesting extradition.

2. Where the requesting state asserts jurisdiction in respect of an offence committed outside its territory the requested state shall grant extradition only where it would assert jurisdiction on a similar basis.

ARTICLE 2

1. Extradition shall be granted only in respect of any act of omission that constitutes an offence set out in the Schedule, provided that such act or omission is a criminal offence punishable under the law of both Contracting Parties.

2. Extradition shall also be granted in respect of any attempt to commit or participation in any offence set out in the Schedule.

3. Extradition shall also be granted in respect of conspiracy to commit an offence under the law of Canada, if such conspiracy constitutes the offence of aiding, abetting, preparation or conspiracy under the law of Finland.

4. For the purposes of this treaty the term "offence" means any act or omission referred to in paragraphs 1., 2. or 3.

5. Extradition shall be granted only if the offence is punishable under the law of both Contracting Parties by imprisonment for a period exceeding one year or by a
