If the host institution requires separate health insurance, the "Auslands-BAFöG" covers this as well. Because the "Auslands-BAFöG" pays for tuition fees, students on a BAFöG scheme are usually only entitled to reduced grants from the "IAS-Stipendium" and the "DAAD-Teilstipendium". As the courses attended at the host university are part of the course work and are accepted by the home university, leave from the home university will not be granted for the time of exchange.

7. IAESTE:

This program is the Exchange of Students for Technical Experience. As the participants are usually paid by the respective company for the period of practical training, only supportive grants for the travel costs are available.
