Mr. Greene, seconded by Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale), moved,—That the said bill be now read a second time and referred to the Standing Committee on National Resources and Public Works.

And debate arising thereon;

By unanimous consent, the House reverted to "Routine Proceedings".

Mr. Clermont, from the Standing Committee on Finance, Trade and Economic Affairs, presented the Second Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:

Your Committee has considered Bill C-6, An Act to wind up the Canadian Corporation for the 1967 World Exhibition and to authorize the writing-off of certain costs and the deferral of certain payments connected therewith, and has agreed to report it without amendment.

## RULING BY MR. SPEAKER

Mr. Speaker: When the motion for second reading of Bill C-144, An Act to provide for the management of the water resources of Canada including research and the planning and implementation of programs relating to the conservation, development and utilization of water resources; was proposed this afternoon, the honourable Member for Peace River (Mr. Baldwin) raised a point of order to the effect that certain financial provisions contained in the bill
