Dear Ruttan:-

Is your resignation from the executive committee of the Biological Board final? If so, I shall regret it very much, not only from the fact that you represent the chemical interests upon the committee, but also on account of the loss of your advice in matters of general policy.

If you are determined upon this step, does it also imply resignation as a member of the Board, and if so, have any steps been taken to appoint somebody to represent McGill in your place? The appointment is made by the University and sent to the Minister for approval, and it seems advisable that steps in this direction should be taken as soon as possible, if they have not already been considered.
