## HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

#### ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office in which the and to be taken is situated, or, if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, or the Commissioner of Dominion Lands, Winnipeg, receive authority for some one to make the entry for him. A fee of \$10 is charged for an ordinary homestead entry; but for lands which have been occupied an additional fee of \$10 s chargeable to meet inspection and cancellation expenses.

### HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

Under the present law homestead duties may be performed under the following conditious: Three years cultivation and residence, during which period the settler may not be absent for more than six months in any one year without forfeiting the entry.

#### APPLICATION FOR PATENT

may be made before the local agent or any homestead inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands of his intention to lo so. When for convenience of settlers, application for patent is made efore a homestead inspector, a fee of \$5 is chargeable.

#### A SECOND HOMESTEAD

may be taken by anyone who has received a homestead patent or a cerificate of recommendation countersigned by the Commissioner of Domnion Lands upon application for patent made by him, or had earned itle to his first homestead on, or prior to, the second day of June. 1889.
