feveral finall rivers, fome of which are navigable to a confiderable diftance. The River St Laurence paffes through the midft of the lake, which is the only part navigable for large veffels in their way to and from Montreal, and is divided into feveral channels, where it enters the lake, forming a number of beautiful iflands, which, as well as the neighbouring continent, are covered with lofty woods, fit for fhipbuilding, and every other commercial purpofe.

From hence it is 45 miles to Montreal, the fecond town of Canada, in point of trade and eminence, feated in a fertile plain, upon an ifland formed by the River St Lau ence, and every where furrounded by a beautiful and well watered country, wholly unincumbered with rocks or mountains, producing excellent fruits, and large crops of wheat, of which they have exported an immenfe quantity to the Weft Indies, and the fouthern flates of Europe, this year.
