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One Method indeed has been hinted at, and but one, that might render the Exercise of this Power in a British Parliament just and legal, which is the Introduction of Representatives from the feveral Colonies into that Body; but as this has never feriously been proposed, I shall not here consider the Impracticability of this Method, nor the Effects of it, if it could be practifed; but only fay, that I have lately feen fo many Specimens of the great Powers of Speech, of which these American Gentlemen are possessed, that I should be much afraid, that the sudden Importation of fo much Eloquence at once, would greatly endanger the Safety and Government of this Country; or in Terms more fashionable, though
