Advance in Column, by the Kight, Quick—March.— Upon each half Preceptory arriving at ten paces from the Reviewing Officer, the half Preceptory Commander will command, eves right, when each Sir Knight will come to the review carry and simultaneously turn his head and eyes to the right and continue looking to the right until ten paces beyond the Reviewing Officer, when the half Preceptory Commander will command, eyes front, whereupon each Sir Knight will come to the ordinary carry, and, at the same time, turn his head and eyes straight to the front.

When the half Preceptory Commanders give eves right, they will execute the salute in four paces. Thus: Raise the sword by extending the right arm and, by a circular motion, bring it to the recover, then continue the motion to the right shoulder, from whence the sword is lowered to the same position as for the salute. These four motions are to be combined into one easy movement and completed in four paces. The head will be turned towards the Reviewing Officer.

When the half Pieceptory Commanders command, eyes front, they will recover swords, make a pause of one pace and then come to the ordinary carry.

The Capt. General will also salute when within four paces of the Reviewing Officer, and, when he arrives two paces behind him, comes to the carry, drops out of column to the right and takes position on the right of the Reviewing Officer. The adjutant will salute in like manner, but will continue with the column.
