first unit of the library stack. This Arts Building might be the one on the plan opposite the Library. When the final Arts Building is erected, that opposite the Science Building, the former would become the Museum.

DORMITORIES NEEDED FOR STUD-ENTS TO LIVE IN

On account of the wretched housing conditions in Halifax, which probably will not change much for the better for some years to come, the University has been confronted with the difficult problem of itself erecting residences, if it is to continue to provide for the students desiring to avail themselves of its advantages. Already it has lost many actual and prospective students because they could find lodging and board only at a very high cost, and even then uncomfortal le and unwholesome. The University can not hold its place in the educational world of the country and allow these conditions to continue. A residence and centre for the life of the women students should be the first building of this nature to be erected; one that will house 60 to 70 students and provide the needed public rooms for all the women students and allow expansion will cost about \$200,000. A like sum will provide dormitory accomodation for about 100 men; and this first unit of a system of men's residences should also be erected at once.
