AUTHOR'S ADVENTUROUS TRIP

Caspar Whitney Has Finished 1000 Mile Journey in American Wilds.

New York, June 3.—A cable has been received from Caspar Whitney, now at Port of Spain, Trinidad, saying: First man to visit hostile Indians head waters Orinoco, after hardest, full of adventure, and most successful exploring and hunting expedition in my career.

In making public this cable message yesterday, Ralph D. Paine, acting editor of Outing, said: "This is the first news received from Mr. Whitney since he left the farthest settlement on the upper Amazon two months ago. Since that time he has made a trip by canoe accompanied only by a few Indians toward the head waters of the Rio Negro, up the Casiquiare and thence toward the Orinoco River and Ciudad Bolivar. A large part of the journey was thru a country previously unknown to the explorer, and among tribes of hostile Indians which have been heard of only in rumors."

The itinerary which Mr. Whitney planned and has carried out single-handedly, encased in membrane from the Amazon into the Rio Negro by trading steamer. From Santa Elena he transferred his outfit to a canoe and paddled 350 miles to the mouth of the Casiquiare River. He followed this stream 200 miles to its junction with the Orinoco, which river he followed down stream by canoe for 300 miles.

OPERATION TO GET GEM.
