A Terrible Crash.

The steamer had mounted the rocks with a terrible crash. The half-speed at which she was steaming carried her partly over the shoal, and the strong southwest swell moved her gradually forward and threatened to plunge her into deep water beyond. No perceptible excitement manifested itself among the passengers. The women were as cool as the men, and they went about the work of saving themselves without the slightest evidence that they realized the awful danger in which they were placed. It was a marvellous exhibition of self-possession almost inconneelvable under the terrifying circumstances.

Firms eligible to contract for the Ontarlo Government printing are finding fault with the new specifications, saying that in no case is the amount required given. The Government now proposes to make the term for the new contract six years, by providing that at the end of three years it may be renewed for another three years by a simple vote of the Legislature.
