ROBIN ON THE G.T.P.

Thinks Better Equipment of C.N.R. and C.P.R. is Needed.

Montreal, Jan. 30.—Premier Roblin, speaking of the G.T.P., said today: "Really, it is difficult to see how the new line can be run so far north as has been proposed, and there is not any use of running it thru any district farther south, because there are sufficient railways in that portion at the present time. The idea of the Grand Trunk building north of Lake Winnipeg, and establishing a branch into the City of Winnipeg is not a feasible one. Manitoba would not give five cents for such a branch. "My personal opinion is that when the Canadian Pacific and Canadian Northern Railways are better equipped they will be able to handle all the business there is in the country. Of course, there are many districts in the Territories that need more railways, but then the present railways could build extensions or branches into them in a far shorter time, and with better results, than if the Grand Trunk Pacific were built."
