

JAPAN MAY CUT **NAVAL PROGRAM**

Minister of Marine Scouts the Suggestion of Competing With U. S. Navy.

Tokio, March 24.-Assertions the Japanese naval program was being collowed for the purpose of competing with the United States navy, were deunced as "preposterous and abe by Vice Admiral Tomosaburo Kato Japanese minister of marine, in an interview with the Associated Press here today. He declared Japan was not trying to compete with the United States navy, and that the Japanese nayal program had been formulated so that the Island Empire could be de-fended against any-emergencies arisng in the far east alone.

During the course of the interview the minister emphasized the fact that Japan's project to have a fleet of eight battleships and eight battle cruisers not over eight years old, was not necessarily irreducible. He indicated that if all the naval powers would agree to a "naval holiday" he would be willing to enter such an engagement, and would not insist upon the completion of the naval program projected by the government.

(Continued From Page 1). of preventing them from leaving Ireland. All seven at present are detained in custody."

Details of Capture. Further details of the men's capture, obtained from an authoritative source, indicate that the three emigrants were village lads from a disant county, who had obtained passports for the United States thru the local petty sessions clerk. They, with the four guards, were found by the auxiliaries in an upper room of an unfurnished and unoccupied house. As the raiders rushed thru the door one man threw a fully-loaded revolver into some waste paper,

Two of the emigrants had traveled to Dublin Tuesday, and the third joined them the next day. The ensuing evening all were seated in a hotel room when a man entered with a revolver. He cried "Hands up!" and demanded their passports. They replied that they had none, and were only going to England, saying this because they feared danger from the Sinn Fein if caught emigrating. As a measure of precaution, they had given their passports to another inmate of the hotel for concealment. After the hotel had been searched the trio were taken to the empty house in a closed cab, where they were questioned, and explained that they wanted to emigrate in order better to support their parents. The raiders found thirty rounds of rifle ammunition hidden under the floor.

The arms, ammunition and equipment taken in the raid on the stables are said to constitute the largest store yet captured. In a ground dioor room the raiders found shelves with loaded revolvers, sighted up to 1000 yards, set in rows. Other shelves bore bombs of all sorts, from small circular ones up to one about the size of an ostrich egg. In a loft above were other bombs and detonators, and also a box containing many sticks of gelignite. In another room were a number of rifles, some of which were concealed in rolls of oll-cloth, in which it was thought they might be carried thru the streets.

The raiders found complete sets of soldiers equipment, including steel hats. In one corner were empty government mail bags and a number of letters addressed to the ministry of pensions and state officials, dated 1920. Five hundred yerds away the auxiliaries raided a garage, where they found a motor car with her containing homes with detenetors bag containing bombs, with detonator affixed on the front seat, and a tele-phone wire tapping equipment, besides two eighteen-pounder shells marked "bloody and dangerous."
