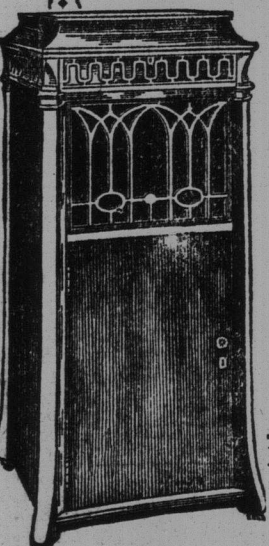

DR. HILLIS FORESEES ANOTHER CIVIL WAR

Predicts That Masses Will Rise Against the Holders of Great Wealth.

The present generation will see a civil war in the United States in which the line-up will be the man with gold against the man without it, according to the Rev. Newell Dwight Hillis, who spoke recently at the annual luncheon of the Presbyterian Ministers Association of New York and vicinity.

Dr. Hillis attacked congress for the way in which it passed the eight hour law. He said that what is needed in this country is to Americanize the foreigner, to intellectualize the worker, to moralize the citizen and to socialize the people.

Dr. Hillis warned his hearers against the effect of statements by labor leaders, who were quoted as saying the labor element would abide by no other law but the eight hour law and that if the militia is called out it will side with labor.

"If that is not an echo of our civil war, I am much mistaken," said Dr. Hillis. "We will live to see the man with gold in a war against the man without it, if there is not a change in Washington. They say hell has gone out of existence. It seems to me when I think of what some men have recently done that it is time hell was re-established."

DRUNKENNESS LESS; BAR-HABITUE GONE

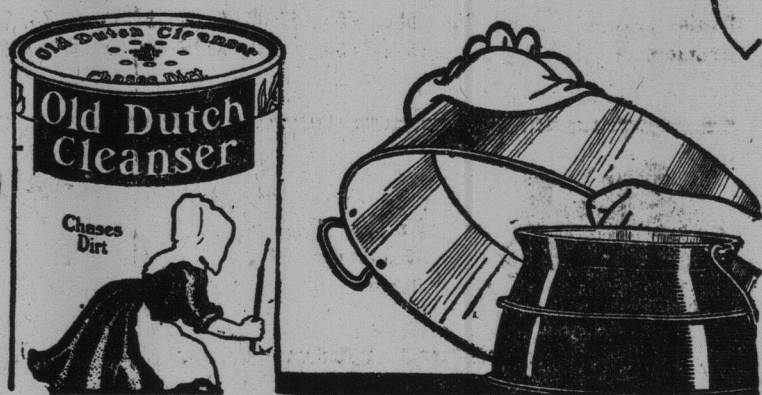
Cases Show Decrease of 1975 for Last Three Months of Year.

(Toronto Star.)
From September 15 to December 15, this year, there were 1,975 fewer arrests for drunkenness in Toronto than during the corresponding three months last year. Those figures were produced at a meeting of the police commissioners this afternoon, and were given out by Chief of Police Grasett as an evidence of the effects of prohibition. "Prohibition has prohibited to that extent," remarked the chief. "The old-time bar-room habitue has gone. The associations and temptations of the barroom which led men to take first the social glass and then the bottle and then the last they couldn't carry away with them, are gone. If there is as much drinking being done now as before prohibition, it is by a new class of drinkers, who do not come into the hands of the police as the old ones did."

The official who gave that testimony in favor of prohibition has been for 30 years the head of the Toronto police force. Dec. 1st was his 30th anniversary in that capacity.

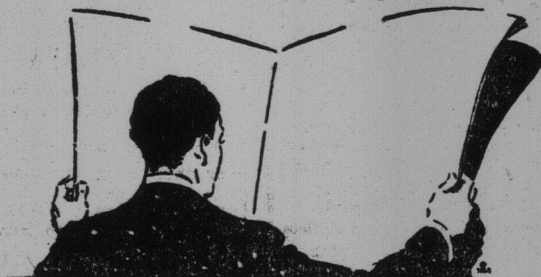

FORD INJUNCTION STANDS

Court Refuses to Remove Barrier to Development Work
Detroit, Mich., Dec. 22.—Three circuit judges have denied the petition of Henry Ford that they annul a temporary in-

junction which retains the Ford Motor Company from undertaking development work. The injunction granted for sixty days was obtained recently by John F. Dodge and Horace E. Dodge, motor car manufacturers and stockholders in the Ford Company. The Dodge brothers are seeking a permanent injunction to compel Mr. Ford to use the profits of his

company for dividends instead of developing the business.
Mr. Ford's attorneys argued that contracts for the construction of a large smelting plant near Detroit were let some time ago and that the Ford Motor Company would lose a large amount of money unless the work could be resumed immediately.
